For the first time since the supply chain shortages caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, CCC was able to buy bikes for children in our program. This dedicated group of volunteers, who had assembled bikes for several years before the pandemic, regrouped in 2023 to build 78 bikes. Funding for the bikes was provided by two generous donors.



LONGTIME DONOR: DIANE SICKELS 'KIDS DESERVE A HAPPY CHRISTMAS'

It was an article in the Waukesha Freeman that introduced Diane Sickels to Christmas Clearing Council (CCC) a quarter of a century ago. Since then, she has helped sponsor children and donated cash every year, and is one of 13 confirmed donors who have supported CCC for 25 years or longer.

As is the case with many supporters, CCC and its mission is not far from Diane's personal experience. "I've known a couple of families that have used it" when they needed help, she said.

For the first few years, Diane sponsored children on her own, but for many years since, she has joined a sponsoring group at her church, Genesee Congregational. She has also inspired some members of her extended family to get involved, too. She and her children have sponsored, and one year, she also got her sister involved as a sponsor. Later, "I told her 'we don't need to give each other gifts. Send a check to CCC instead." She has also encouraged her three now grown children to donate or sponsor instead of giving gifts to her.

Her motivation? "Kids deserve a happy Christmas - and helping makes me feel good."



In 1949, when a small, but dedicated group started what became Christmas Clearing Council, they had one mission: to share the magic of Christmas with families struggling financially. Our mission remains the same 75 years later. Unfortunately, for some families, so has the struggle to make ends meet. Financial hardship looks different today than it did decades ago, and it doesn't take much to send a family on the brink right over the edge. A job loss, a serious health issue, a fire, homelessness, rising mortgage rates – these and other major losses can impact a family's finances for years. We have policies to ensure client families meet our criteria, while remaining focused on our mission: that every child, regardless of their parents' financial circumstances, experiences joy at Christmas.
